YCAN would like to speak about achieving the City of Yarra's objectives for a "Healthy, Sustainable, Liveable and Connected City.

In reference to Active transport and bicycle infrastructure

- 1. Reducing Greenhouse Gas Emissions is essential to combatting climate change. NB: recent reports suggest that it is becoming increasingly difficult to restrict temperature increase to less that 1.5deg. Motorised vehicles are a major producer of emissions.
- 2. More cyclists and pedestrians mean fewer vehicles on Yarra's roads
- 3. Cycling numbers will only increase with better and safer infrastructure
- 4. A couple of points stand out in a new City of Melbourne discussion paper, Bicycles for Everyday Transport a) 83% of people are confident to ride in a protected lane, compared with 22% in a non-protected one, and b) numbers of Yarra cyclists travelling to CBD could more than double if people felt safer and better facilities were supplied.

YCAN urges Council to:

- 1. implement the BAC recommendations for bicycle infrastructure
- 2. follow UN recommendations that 205 of transport spending be for active transport
- 3. clarify budget to show actual spending for bike and pedestrian infrastructure, rather than many aspects being bundled into raod and footpath funding.

In addition:

While not strictly budget items, YCAN see it as essential that Council:

- 1. work with surrounding municipalities and the State Government to enable it to participate and influence future active transport policies in the municipality and Melbourne-wide
- 2. develop a new four-year Bicycle Strategy Plan as a matter of urgency. Without this, Yarra risks being left behind.
